**December 17, 2012**

1. **Call to Order:** Commission Chair Kari McAllister called the meeting to order at 6:34 PM.
2. **Pledge of Allegiance:** Commissioners recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. **Approval of Minutes of Meeting of November 19, 2012**

**Board Action:** It was moved and seconded (Bennett/Harrison) to approve the minutes of the meeting of November 19, 2012. Motion carried by all present Commissioners.

5. **Public Comment:** Director Reinhart welcomed and introduced Youth Services Manager Clio Hathaway and Impact Academy Intern David Graham.

6. **Report from the Director of Library and Community Services.** Director Reinhart referred Commissioners to the Library Statistical Report for November 2012, included in their agenda packets, for information on recent circulation activity. He commented on the noticeable decrease in this area and explained that it is mainly attributable to a drop in DVD circulation as a result of budget cuts. In

order to help balance the budget for fiscal year 2013, it was necessary to reduce the book and media budget by thirty percent. A large amount of the cut was in the DVD budget, thus causing this approximate ten percent drop in overall circulation. Director Reinhart noted that he is working with the collection development staff to review the current budget to identify additional funding, within the current materials budget, which can be redirected toward DVD purchases to fulfill the community's request for more availability and selection.

Director Reinhart acknowledged library staff and community members for attending the recent world premiere of the documentary, *Now We Can Dance-The Story of the Hayward Gay Prom*, on December 7. The film was created by local teens, under the guidance of library staff members, Laurie Willis, Shawna Sherman, and Sally Thomas. The film highlights the history of the gay prom (one of the longest-running events of its kind in the country) and its impact on attendees and the community. Director Reinhart asked the Commissioners about possibly screening the film at an upcoming library commission meeting. The Commissioners agreed.

7. **Friends of the Hayward Public Library Report.** Commissioner Harrison, President of the Friends of the Library, reported \$1,230 in sales from the two (Saturday) December book sales and acknowledged the \$4,000 donation from the Bonnie Smith trust. Ms. Smith was a long-time Friend of the Library who passed away a few years ago. This donation request was made to specifically purchase e-books and audio books. Commissioner Harrison commended the Friends of the Library for their participation in providing the refreshments and treats for the Gay Prom event.
8. **Library Commission Report.** Commissioner Schultz advised the group that members of the General Plan Task Force have been assigned to put together workshops to gather the community's feedback on the different ways to improve Hayward. The feedback that is received will be added to the General Plan Update. Commissioner Schultz asked about scheduling a workshop sometime in January that would include all members of the Library Commission, Friends of the Hayward Library, and the Literacy Plus Council.

Commissioner Harrison mentioned that she visited the CALTAC website recently, and discovered that they are now known as (CPLA) California Public Library Advocates. She commented about one of their upcoming workshops called, Guerrilla Advocacy - It's a Jungle Out There! The workshop will be held on Saturday, March 16, 2013, at San Mateo Public Library.

Commissioner Greenne commented that she attended the last Restaurant Walk and expressed her thoughts about it. Director Reinhart added that fewer tickets were sold this time around. He said he will check the final amounts and report back to the Commissioners.

9. **City Council Liaison Report.** Council Member Salinas shared that the city produced their year-end budget report recently which showed a slight increase in revenue this year, approximately 2.2%, which means that the city will end up using \$1.7 million in city reserves instead of \$4.5 million, as previously estimated. He added that in early 2013, the city will begin labor negotiations with several of the labor groups. Council Member Salinas mentioned that an ordinance for illegal dumping was just passed, and advised the Commissioners to contact him if they were interested in receiving more information on this topic.

Council Member Salinas also shared that after much discussion, he was able to get a chapter dedicated in the General Plan Update that deals with issues that surround schools and education.

Council Member Salinas mentioned that City Council, in collaboration with the Economic Development Committee, is developing an Economic Development Strategic Plan. The city hopes to have the plan completed and implemented by summer/fall of 2013.

**10. New Business.**

- a. **Staff Presentation on Library Services-Bilingual Family Outreach.** Youth Services Manager Clio Hathaway distributed the Early Spanish Learning program's 2012 Progress Report Executive Overview, and delivered a brief presentation on the services provided by the program. The program's main goal is to provide services to Spanish speaking children under the age of five which helps prepare them for success when they enter kindergarten. - b. **Customer Conduct Policy.** Director Reinhart distributed revised copies of the customer conduct policy that included the two changes that were suggested by the Commissioners at the November meeting. It was moved and seconded (Greenne/Brunner) to approve the updated Customer Conduct Policy. Motion carried by all present Commissioners.
- c. **Library and Community Learning Center Design Visualization Update.** Director Reinhart provided an update on the new library design project. Noll and Tam Architects are currently working on designing 3-D graphic digital renderings, of both the interior and exterior, for the new Library and Community Learning Center. These designs will be used as visuals in support of talking points about the new library. Director Reinhart will be meeting with the architects soon to discuss the schedule of events for various meetings with library staff, library commissioners, and other key stakeholders. City Council is planning on reviewing the completed visualization designs at their July 16, 2013, council meeting.
- d. **Talking Points for Library Commission.** Director Reinhart suggested that a meeting be set up between himself and the President/Board Chairs of the Library Commission, Friends of the Library, and Literacy Plus Council to discuss and develop key talking points, and discuss the new library visualization designs. A later meeting will be scheduled to include the rest of the board members. Director Reinhart added that the Commissioner's talking points should focus mainly on explaining the value of the new Library and Community Learning Center project to the community.

If I can be of any assistance during the time it will take to fill the position, please don't hesitate to ask.







**AVERAGE CIRCULATION per ITEM**






### Educational Program Attendance by Year
