Adopt an ordinance introduced by Council Member Henson at a meeting of the Hayward City Council on May 11, 1999.


BACKGROUND:

PUBLIC NOTICE OF AN INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAYWARD

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4, ARTICLE 3 OF THE CARD CLUB
REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF HAYWARD TO COMPLY WITH CHANGES IN
STATE LAW

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAYWARD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4-3.14.1 of the Hayward Municipal Code is hereby added to read in full as follows:

"SEC. 4-3.14.1 COMPLIANCE WITH STATE GAMBLING CONTROL ACT. A permit shall not be issued to any person who would be disqualified based on any of the applicable licensing criteria set forth in California Business and Professions Code, Section 19850, or has been objected to in writing by the Division of Gambling Control of the State Department of Justice. Such criteria includes:

- (a) Failure of the applicant to clearly establish eligibility and qualification.
- (b) Failure of the applicant to provide information, documentation and assurances required.
- (c) Convicted of a felony, including conviction by a federal court or a court in another state for crime that would constitute a felony.
- (d) Conviction of the applicant for any misdemeanor involving dishonesty or moral turpitude within a 10-year period proceeding submission of the application.
- (e) Association with a criminal profiteering activity or organized crime.
- (f) Contumacious defiance by the applicant of any legislative investigatory body, or other official investigatory body of any state or of the United States, when that body is engaged in the investigation of crimes relating to gambling.
- (g) The applicant is less than 21 years of age.

Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of section 620 of the City Charter, this ordinance shall become effective 30 days from and after the date of its adoption.

Introduced at a regular meeting of the Hayward City Council held May 11, 1999, the above-entitled ordinance was introduced by Council Member Henson. This ordinance will be considered for adoption at the next meeting of the Hayward City Council, to be held on May 18, at 8:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers, 777 B Street, Hayward, California.
