SUBJECT: Pavement Reconstruction 2002-03: Approval of Plans and Specifications and Call for Bids

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution that approves the plans and specifications for the Pavement Reconstruction 2002-03 project and calls for bids to be received on June 29, 2004.

BACKGROUND:

This project is part of a new, annual street maintenance program that involves reconstruction or major repair of severely deteriorated streets in order to bring them up to acceptable pavement standards. This year's project includes the reconstruction of Donald Avenue from Culp Avenue to Harder Road, Myrtle Avenue from B Street to C Street, and Ramos Avenue from Sycamore Avenue to Silva Avenue. This project consists of removing the existing pavement and underlying layers and replacing it with a deep-lift asphalt concrete roadway section. The decision to reconstruct these streets was based on various factors. First, the selection of streets for rehabilitation is based on staff's analysis of the pavement condition indices identified through the City's computerized Pavement Management Program (PMP), along with specific field examination and the functional classification of each street. Typical rehabilitation usually involves making deep-lift asphalt concrete spot repairs and placing either an asphalt concrete overlay or slurry seal on the various streets. This work is generally performed with our annual Pavement Rehabilitation Program. However, staff has determined that these streets have severely deteriorated pavement that would require a major amount of deep-lift repairs, which would not be cost effective. Additionally, due to the high crown on the streets, an overlay would improve the riding surface but may cause additional problems for residents entering and leaving their properties. This project will remove the existing crown and produce better access and ride-ability. In the past, local streets with a pavement index below 30 have generally not been reconstructed due to insufficient funding. This new annual program is made possible by the allocation of LAVWMA funding.

This project is categorically exempt under the "Operation, Repair, Maintenance, or Minor Alteration of Existing Facilities" section of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines.


FUNDING:




