It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached Ordinance.




The ordinance was published in the Hayward Daily Review on December 17, 2005. Adoption at this time is therefore appropriate.

Draft Ordinance

PUBLIC NOTICE OF AN INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAYWARD

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE 5,
SECTIONS 10-5.00 AND 10-5.10 OF THE HAYWARD
MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO STREET NAMES AND
PROPERTY NUMBERS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAYWARD DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sec.10-5.00 and 10-5.10 of the Hayward Municipal Code "Street Names and Property Numbers" is hereby amended to read as follows:

STREET NAMES AND PROPERTY NUMBERS

SEC.10-5.00 PURPOSE. The public interest, safety, welfare and convenience requires the establishment of a numbering system of street and road addresses in a uniform plan for the City of Hayward, said plan shall be in agreement with the Alameda County Property Numbering System, being Chapter 15.32 of the Alameda County Ordinance Code or alternative system approved by the City Enforcing Official.

SEC. 10-5.10 THE SYSTEM. The City Council of the City of Hayward hereby establishes a numbering system of street and road addresses for this City in accordance with the Alameda County property Numbering System which shall be known as the Hayward Portion of the Alameda County Property Numbering System, which shall be effective within the City of Hayward. An alternative system may be employed when it can be shown that the alternative system carries out the purpose of this Article and when the alternative system would not result in a disconnection of an established property numbering pattern within Hayward as determined by the City Enforcing Official.

Section 2. Severance. Should any part of this ordinance be declared by a final decision by a court or tribunal of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, invalid, or beyond the authority of the City, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect, provided that the remainder of the ordinance, absent the unexcised portion, can be reasonably interpreted to give effect to the intentions of the City Council.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after adoption by the City Council.

Introduced at a meeting of the Hayward City Council held December 13, 2005, the above-entitled ordinance was introduced by Council Member Ward.

This ordinance will be considered for adoption at the next meeting of the Hayward City Council, to be held on December 20, 2005, at 8:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers, 777 B Street, Hayward, California. The full text of this ordinance is available for examination by the public in the Office of the City Clerk.
