MEETING

The Meeting of the City Council was called to order by Mayor Cooper at 8:00 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor/Chair Cooper.

Mayor Cooper asked for a moment of silence in honor of Council Member Matt “Mateo” Jimenez, who passed away on July 3, 2006.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Cooper announced that there will be a Special City Council Meeting on Thursday, July 13, regarding the Council vacancy caused by the death of Council Member Jimenez and that it will be held in the Council Chambers and televised. She noted that opportunity for discussing that topic will be provided at that time. She requested that this evening’s Public Comments not include discussion on this topic.

Ann Steers, Gwen Edmonds, Ken Everett and Neil Shumate, spoke in support of creating a sewer benefit district regarding Picea Court and supported the Shumate family.

Terry Higgins provided a tribute to former Council Member Matt “Mateo” Jimenez.

Joseph Oberman congratulated the newly elected members of the City Council. He also paid tribute in the passing of our former Council Member Jimenez.

John Morro, residing at Thackeray Street, spoke in support of Robert Lopez.

Garrett Contreras, representing Hayward Firefighters Local 1909, expressed appreciation to Mayor Cooper for her service and presented her with a huge bouquet of flowers.

Lee Williamson expressed his gratitude to Mayor Cooper for her many years in serving this community and wished her well in her retirement.

Robert Lopez paid tribute to former Council Member Matt “Mateo” Lopez and asked for an open mind during the appointment process.

Tony Lobato spoke in support of Robert Lopez to fill the vacancy on the Hayward City Council.

Staff report submitted by City Clerk Reyes, dated July 11, 2006, was filed.

City Clerk Reyes made the report, providing the total ballots cast for each candidate in both the Mayor and two Council Member races as listed in the official canvass conducted by the Interim Registrar of Voters. She indicated that the Hayward’s voter turnout was 36.6% and recommend that Council certify the results.

Mayor Cooper opened and closed the public hearing at 8:40 p.m.

It was moved by Mayor Cooper, seconded by Council Member Ward, and unanimously carried to adopt the following:

Resolution 06-090, “Resolution Acknowledging Receipt of Canvass by the City Clerk of General Municipal Election Held June 6, 2006, and Declaring the Results Thereof”

Mayor Cooper expressed her gratitude and shared a fond farewell. Council Member Ward thanked Mayor Cooper for her years of service and on behalf of the entire Council, presented Mayor Cooper with a framed commendation, a plaque expressing her years of service, her gavel and flowers. Lastly, as she left the dais, her name plate was also presented to her.

City Clerk Reyes called Mayor Elect Sweeney forward and administered the Oath of Office and presented him with a Certificate of Office. He then took his place as Mayor at the Council dais.

City Clerk called Council Member Dowling to the podium, administered the Oath of Office and presented him with a Certificate of Office.

Mayor Sweeney thanked his supporters, spoke on his availability and what he anticipates. He discussed his priorities as increased public safety for safer neighborhoods, urging increased participation and becoming stakeholders in education, improved after school opportunities for youth, an energy policy and overall improvement of city services.

Council Member Dowling thanked the voters, city staff and supporters that included a number of unions for his third. He looked forward to working with the new mayor and cited the number of projects that take Hayward forward and in new directions. He shared his experience and the number of years he has been involved starting with his involvement in task forces. He acknowledged Simone Jimenez and paid tribute to former Council Member Jimenez. He also acknowledged Supervisor Gail Steele and Senatorial Candidate Ellen Corbett, who were present. He urged increased public engagement to make this community a great city.

Mayor Sweeney then returned to the next item on the Agenda.

4. Selection of Mayor Pro Tempore

Staff report submitted by City Clerk Reyes, dated July 11, 2006, was filed.

Mayor Sweeney stated that the report provides information for the Council and asked for a motion.

With no requests to speak, Mayor Sweeney closed the public hearing at 9:24 p.m.

It was moved by Council Member Ward, seconded by Council Member Dowling, and unanimously carried to adopt the following:

Resolution 06-091, "Resolution Authorizing the Election of Mayor Pro Tempore of the City of Hayward for 2006-2007"

Council Member Halliday was elected unanimously to serve as Mayor Pro Tempore for the next fiscal year and she thanked the Council.
