Co-Mingled Recyclables Collection

Materials are co-mingled and collected by Waste Management in carts or bins, as shown.

Collection of mixed recyclables is available to businesses at *no additional charge*.

Acceptable materials include many types of paper, as well as food and beverage containers made of glass, plastic and metal.

About 50% of the businesses in the City participate in this program, of which more than half started in the past two years.

Organics Collection

Rates are *half the price* of garbage service. Businesses may use carts or bins, as shown.

Acceptable materials include:

- fruits and vegetables
- clean wood
- meat, fish, poultry and dairy
- food-soiled paper

Eighty-one businesses participate in this program, of which more than half started in the past two years. The finished compost is used as a soil amendment.

The restaurant participates in collection of recyclables and organics services. Reusable dishes and utensils are provided for customers.

Gourmet Foods has implemented recyclables and organics collection services. They also conserve water using an automated hand washing system that regulates water flow.

Vicolo Wholesale


Vicolo, which means “little alley,” manufactures and distributes pizza made with organic bread and fresh ingredients.


Vicolo has been a strong advocate for environmental practices. They have implemented organics collection services and reuse their cardboard boxes and newspaper for packaging.
