The mission of the Alameda CTC is to **Plan, Fund and Deliver** transportation programs and projects that expand access and improve mobility to foster a vibrant and livable Alameda County.

Alameda CTC is the congestion management agency and authority that manages voter-approved measures to fund transportation improvements including Alameda County's half-cent transportation sales tax and vehicle registration fee.

Alameda CTC delivers on average \$160 million each year in transportation improvements through:

- Transportation planning and programming.
- Program and project delivery.
- Legislation and policies to support congestion relief, mobility and accessibility.

- Transit Oriented Development
- Transportation Technology

Deliver

Maintaining and improving our transportation infrastructure is critical to ensure a system that moves goods and people and supports economic vitality. **Alameda CTC funds and oversees numerous transportation capital projects in Alameda County** that improve highway corridors, provide accessible public transit, maintain and improve local streets and roads, and ensure safe travel for pedestrians and bicyclists. Key projects include:

- High-occupancy vehicle lanes and other corridor improvements on highway corridors.
- Transit projects such as AC Transit, Altamont Commuter Express improvements, BART Oakland Airport Connector, BART Warm Springs Extension, Fruitvale Station and Union City Intermodal Station.
- Traffic circulation/intersection improvements.
- Arterial improvements throughout the county.
- Bicycle/pedestrian routes, pathways, facilities.

The Alameda CTC supports local businesses and creates jobs through its Local Business Contract Equity Program.
