


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



When you donate a book, CD, DVD or miscellaneous items, do you wonder how they get processed to be presented in one of the 29 book sales the Friends of the Library conduct each year?



RETE 3 and RETE 7

RETE 9 and RETE 13

- Ideal for fast, continuous hot water at a lavatory or sink
- RETE 9 (9kW/240V) requires a dedicated 40 AMP breaker
- RETE 13 (13kW/240V) requires a dedicated 60 AMP breaker

RETE 18 and RETE 27

- Designed for fast, continuous hot water in a bathroom addition/renovation or single shower
- RETE 18 (18kW/240V) requires two dedicated 40 AMP breakers



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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

What are the City's critical needs that make Measure C necessary? (listed alphabetically)

FIRE: Hayward's fire stations are aging and many need serious upgrades. Most of the city's fire stations were built more than 50 years ago. Some of the Hayward's busiest stations have water damage, cracked foundations, and electrical systems that don't meet current safety codes.

LIBRARY: The main library was built in 1951, when Hayward had a population of 14,000 people. Today, Hayward is the Bay Area's fifth largest city, with 150,000 residents. **The 63-year old library** has become inadequate and deteriorated trying to keep up with growing community demand. In particular, it lacks much needed after-school homework and tutoring space and has become woefully incapable of keeping pace with current and advancing technology in the information age.

POLICE: Over the past six years, Hayward police have been stretched thin. The department needs increased staffing and other resources in order to meet the safety needs of our community now and in the future.

ROAD MAINTENANCE: The City currently maintains 659 miles of streets and roads. The pavement condition score currently stands at 69 (fair). To bring the average

condition up to 80 (good) would require nearly triple the City's current annual budget for road maintenance.

How will Measure C work?

If approved by Hayward voters, Measure C will apply to the same goods and services purchased in Hayward as the existing state sales tax. **Items that are exempt** from sales tax include groceries, sales of prescription medicine and certain medical devices, and sales of items paid for with food stamps. **Where Measure C will apply:** furniture, cars, giftware, toys, antiques and clothing and other goods and services.

How much will Measure C cost?

The cost depends on the amount of qualified goods or services purchased. What WON'T be included: basic necessities like groceries and prescription medications. That said, Measure C would add 50 cents to every \$100 of goods or services purchased. For the purchase of a \$50 item, the local sales tax would amount to 25 cents. The additional cost applied to the purchase of a new \$1,200 television would be \$6.

Will Measure C apply to EVERYONE?

YES. Even visitors to Hayward will pay their fair share, so residents won't shoulder the entire cost.


